SUTRO'S API NOW 864!

◆ Our school's California Academic Performance Index (API) for 2009 jumped 28 points to 864! For the API, the range is 200 to 1000 with a score of 800 being an outstanding school. We are higher than the state's average (755) and the District's average (777). A couple of years ago, we implemented new teaching strategies and academic programs and they are finally paying off.
